

esteemed watchmaking brand dedicated exclusively to Tourbillions, Cecil Purnell marks the move of its technical office to Geneva with the introduction of a new model that maintains the consistency of the key elements of the brand's corporate philosophy - its knowhow, its independence, its commitment to the true values of Haute Horlogerie. The unveiling of the Caliber 3888 bolsters the brand dedicated exclusively to Tourbillions in its mastery of

complications. The lifting of the dial, reveals the depth, complexity and finishing on a mechanism transcended.

Cecil Purnell's in-house 3888 caliber, proudly developed with watchmaker Cedric Grandperret within reputed micro-manufacture Magma in Geneva, was envisaged to provide a novel perspective to the meticulousness of fine watchmaking. The resulting mechanical masterpiece exudes the movements' echelons and finest finishes, emanating as an expression of a timeless aesthetic that marks the exclusive classic models the brand has to offer. The movement comprising 190 components draws on an elevated sapphire ring and dauphine markers (floating at 1.4 mm above the bridge) to accentuate the entire movement face, although it is not to be mistaken with a skeleton. Tourbillon Complementing the delicate finishing mechanism, reinforces the depths and beauty of the entire movement.

HUBLOT 'CATHEDRAL' MINUTE REPEATER TOURBILLON AND COLUMN WHEEL CHRONOGRAPH


This watch has three coveted complications, a minute repeater watch featuring two "cathedral" type gongs, a tourbillon and column wheel chronograph, with carbon fibre bridges, in a case made from carbon fibre. The minute repeater, activated by means of a lever situated between 8 and 10 o'clock, sounds the hours, quarter-hours and minutes. It is integrated into the King Power case middle, just like the chronograph control push-piece is subtly integrated into the watch's crown.



This watch which comes in 41 mm and 44 mm cases features four retrograde hands which indicate day, night and phases of the moon. Apart from the regular functions it also features a 24-hour second time-zone on the left-hand side of the dial and a small seconds area at 6 o'clock.











MONT BLANC TOURBILLON MYSTERIEUSE

This 47 mm watch in a white gold case features, a manual Winding movement and a 1-minute tourbillion at 12 o clock. The hour and minute hands are indicated on sapphire crystal disks.

ESSENCE OF TIME

Bedat & Co. is feeling the wind of change but remains firmly rooted to its core values

THE LAST TWO YEARS HAVE BEEN eventful ones for luxury watch brand, Bedat & Co., with the passing of founder Madame Simone Bedat and the change of hands to Malaysian company Luxury Concepts bringing new tidings. "The 2010 collection is a rebirth for the brand," says Director of Creations, Dino Modolo, who was in Kuala Lumpur for A Journey Through Time IV. A close personal friend and long-time collaborator of Madame Simone, it was the brand's continued commitment to remain rooted to its core values which convinced Modolo to stay on in his position, creating exquisitely beautiful timepieces made with authentic Swiss expertise.

The 2010 collection, on prominent display for this exclusive event, is an excellent example of Bedat & Co's roots and its core values, predominantly about getting in touch with the feminine side. "For Bedat, since the first moment of putting pencil to paper, ladies are present in our minds. Not only in terms of aesthetics but also in terms of behaviour, occupation and what it means to be a woman today," says Modolo. The feminine design is related to the spirit of female empowerment and to the indomitable spirit of the founder herself as a single woman and mother. Then there is the engineering to suit the smaller, daintier female wrist. Other brands downsize their men's watches to suit the ladies, but in Bedat, that is not the case. In fact, it is the other way around.

Bedat & Co. enriched its No 2 and No 8 lines with models reflecting its Art Deco traditions and the exceptional techniques of the best Jura craftsmen. Excitingly, it has also developed an haute joaillerie line called Extravaganza, to create rare masterpieces for the brand. Four watches were launched in this line, from Ref 880 to 883, with designs playing with the brilliance of baguette-cut diamonds or in the case of Ref 883, an exceptional mother-of-pearl Art Deco marquetery.



A YOUNG WATCH BRAND, THE HIGHLY exclusive Cecil Purnell was founded in 2006 by watchmaking and committed to only produce Tourbillons. "The most fun watch or the most aesthetically pleasing to own is the tourbillon. We will not make anything but the tourbillon: we're going to be in the premium category, it is better to just focus on one thing," says Jonatha Purnell, whose grandfather, a collector and connoisseur of fine watchmaking, inspired the name of the brand.

A small setup, Cecil Purnell makes about 5 watches a year. Their point of differentiation is that they manufacture their own movements through the acquisition of a majority in Magni Concept, a movement creator and designer of watches. Because of their small size, they can easily accommodate requests for customised pieces. "What we try to give our customers is a extremely limited edition article, something which denotes a tremendous amount of classic Purnell says.

This year Cecil Purnell achieved a milestor manufacturing their own caliber, the CP3888, with a priority on precision but with guarantee power reserve of up to 60 hours. Composed of 190 components, entirely hand-finished by the craftsmen, it is realised in two models, the Classique 43 and 47, while the Hambergé runs the older CP 3008.



COMPLICATED CREATION

THE NEW GMT model from Greubel & Forsey, which debuts this month at SIHH, marks a significant milestone for the brand, as it is the company's first timepiece to feature a complication other than a tourbillon. In this case the watch is distinguished by an eye-catching rotating globe offering a view of the time all over the world, as well as a 24-seconds tourbillon.

Nestled at 8 o'clock, the 'flying' fitanium globe is ingeniously secured at just one end of its rotational axis—the South Pole – allowing for optimal views. While the globe makes one complete rotation every 24 hours counterclockwise, the position of the continents can be neatly cross-referenced with the 24-hour, day-and-night indicator on the equatorial chapter ring. The nighttime hemisphere is indicated by a blackened half of the ring around the globe, while a whitened portion indicates the daytime hemisphere. On the back is the 'worldtime' disc bearing the names of 24 cities each representing one of the different global time zones.

CECIL PURNELL IS an haute hortogerie brand specializing in the creation of watches with tourbillon escapements. The Swiss-based firm, which recently relocated to Plan-Les-Quates, in the Canton of Geneva, recently-announced its new La Croix model. With La Croix, Cecil Purnell demonstrates that its strengths go beyond the merely technical, and extend to bold and creative case design. Cecil Purnell's La Croix is shown here in rose gold and is also available in white gold; its dimensions are large and modern: 47 mm from top to bottom and 61 mm from side to side. The movement powering the piece is the in-house CP3888, a manually wound tourbillon caliber with 60 hours of power reserve.

Grandfather's CLOCK

AS A RELATIVE NEWCOMER TO HAUTE HORLOGERIE, CECIL PURNELL IS WITHOUT COMPROMISE WHEN IT COMES TO ITS EXQUISITE TOURBILLON WATCHES.

eciding to start a fine watch company at the age of 50 takes some doing, especially when you plan to make only tourbillon watches and have the movements made entirely us-house. "We chose not to be the watch for everybody but to make only tourbillons, because it was always classed as the highest pedigree in watchmaking circles," says Jonathan Pirrnell, chairman and managing director of Cecil Pirrnell, a company he named after his grandfather While a number of newer watch brands including those from high fashion houses opt to buy movements from established third parties, Jonathan knew that to aim to rank among the best

watchmakers in the world, he would have to be in complete control of the creation and quality of his watch movements---an expensive proposition in a world where outsourcing has become an easy option. "Our watches are not made by a third party watchmaker in the lost areas of Switzerland, and 80 per cent of our components are made in-house." Headquartered in Fribourg, Switzerland, Jonathan and partners Marcel Lachat and Stephane Valsamides spent some years scouring the Juna valley and testing watchmakers who could create tourbillons and movements exclusively for the company. They found few who could live up to their expectations. "We were disappointed with what we found so we went on looking for other suppliers and movements. We could have gone to Renaud & Papi and the company that made movements for Chanel. but this would put us in the OEM [Original Equipment Manufacturer] category." Resisting the option to simply acquire movements from third parties, the trio would spend some years getting their formula right. In fact, Purnell would go on to buy out an independent watchmaker and then exit the company when its priorities didn't align with the charman's. Today, the company has retained two watchmakers to exclusively make movements for Cecil Purnell.

To further differentiate his watches, Jonathan sought to create a specific tourbillon. "Our inovements run at 21,600 vibrations per hour, which is one of the hardest watches to adjust, but it is one of the most reliable frequencies for a tourbillon at 3Hz. You are then getting a movement that's highly accurate. We also put our tourbillon cage between two bridges, which is the traditional way.

of doing it. Flying tourbillous didn't exist for 150 years because they couldn't make ball bearings small enough to make them work. If you take Vacheron Constantin and Patek Philippe—they don't make flying tourbillous because they make it the traditional way—between two bridges. We do the same thing," he says.

With a life spent in the collection and sale of diamonds, estate jewellery, and vintage watches for hunself, international royalty and magnates, it could be said that Jonathan Purnell knew exactly how to source the right would do all the oring and calibrate the watches by hand. By stopwatch. The fantasies and the ideas that come from such moments back then are still vivid in my mind."
